MAYOR'S MESSAGE

This is the first publication of our quarterly newsletter since the April municipal election, in which Dr. Aaron Wahl was re-elected as a Council Member for Ward 2. Congratulations to Aaron! The incumbent Councilmembers in the other three wards were unopposed and will return for another two-year term.

Chesterfield voters rejected Proposition U, or the Use-Tax, receiving only 37% approval. One may wonder why the measure failed by such a wide margin since it had gained more than 48% approval last year. Here are my observations that may provide some insights.

- The Missouri Legislature gave the State of Missouri a 4.225% "Use Tax" for purchases made from another state, without any further voter approval. The State Legislature simultaneously required voter approval for municipalities to apply their existing local sales taxes on out-of-state purchases. Chesterfield sought voter approval to apply our existing 1% sales tax (which would be in addition to the state portion).
- Many voters are simply not inclined to voluntarily approve of a different tax, regardless of the rationale or justification for it.
- I believe there is such a high degree of political polarization, frustration, and mistrust of Federal Government that people tend to correlate all levels of government, and by association, do not recognize that municipal government by design is considerably more responsive, accountable, and transparent.
- Although unrelated, there was confusion and lingering misinformation put forth regarding the approved Tax Increment Financing (TIF) of public infrastructure projects within and around redevelopment of Chesterfield Mall. It has been established and the TIF is structured to ensure that there are no abatements or subsidies. Developers will pay their full tax assessments based on the value of their properties. School Districts will benefit tremendously from increased assessed valuations.
- Finally, there were two out-of-town dark money Political Action Committees that spent thousands of dollars putting forth misinformation about the financial condition of the City of Chesterfield that was misleading to voters and urged them to vote against the proposition.

Although I am personally disappointed that the measure failed, I am confident that our City will continue to provide excellent services through our Internationally Accredited Police Department, Internationally Accredited Public Works Department, and Nationally Accredited Parks, Recreation & Arts Department.

Busy season and continued development

As we enter the summer season, I look forward to a full schedule of summer concerts at our Chesterfield Amphitheater that features both free and ticketed events. I hope to see you there.

Perfect Game commemorated their partnership with the City on April 29 at the Chesterfield Valley Athletic Complex (CVAC). They will host 40 or more tournaments annually, bringing top quality competition to play on our new synthetic turfed baseball/softball infields, bringing visitors to Chesterfield Valley, generating activity for our restaurants, attractions, businesses, and hotels.

The Chesterfield Sports Complex opened this spring and is now hosting youth basketball and volleyball competitions. They have also already hosted gymnastics and martial art events at their facility and anticipate events for other sports as well as strength training and physical rehabilitation services.

The development at Wildhorse Village is forging ahead and The District continues its transformation to an entertainment-based venue.

As if that wasn't impressive enough, I'm sure you have seen Gateway Studio Production Services taking shape at the intersection of Chesterfield Airport Road and Spirit of St. Louis Blvd. This facility is built to be a world class production studio with all of the attendant amenities.

11th Annual Ed Nestor Memorial Backstoppalooza

Last year's concert was held on August 27, 2022, and the Chesterfield Police Department raised another \$88,000 for Backstoppers. Backstoppalooza was started in 2013 after the Line of Duty Deaths of two of our own Chesterfield Police Officers and is held each year at the Chesterfield Amphitheater.



All proceeds from the concert (corporate donations, food, beverage, and t-shirt sales) support The Backstoppers. The Backstoppers have been so very helpful to our officers' families and an absolute relief to the families of all fallen first responders. Since the inception of Backstoppalooza, the event has raised over \$480,000 including last year's receipts of \$88,000.

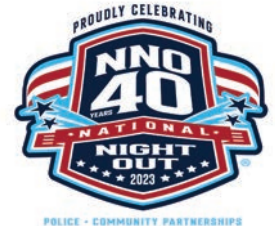

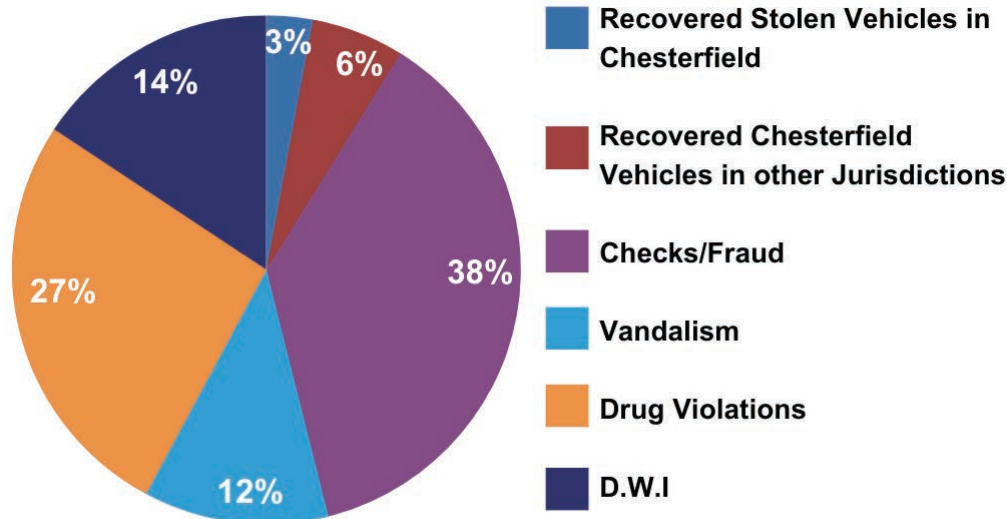

Golf Carts on City Streets

Just a reminder to our residents...it has always been, and it is STILL illegal to operate a golf cart on public roadways within the City of Chesterfield! Although this subject was discussed and reviewed extensively by the City's Public Health and Safety Committee of Council, the final decision was to continue to only allow properly licensed motor vehicles and low speed vehicles (LSV's) to operate within the city.

While there are some general similarities in appearance, and, clearly some confusion among the public regarding what is a golf cart and what is a LSV, the simple differentiation is the state licensing. If it doesn't have a properly affixed Missouri State motor vehicle license plate, it cannot be driven on public roadways within the City of Chesterfield.

Please help keep our kids, residents, and our roadways safe by operating only licensed vehicles on our City roadways!

Keep those pool covers in good condition as well, because if water collects on the top of them, they can become a breeding ground for insects, reptiles, etc. Please be mindful of neighbors while draining pools. 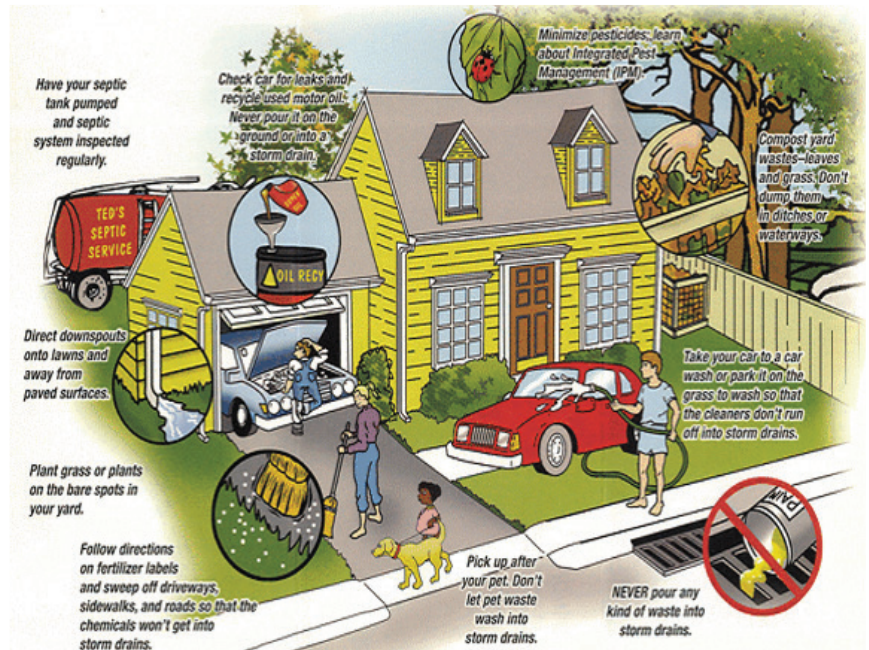


Water Quality

Did you know that in order to permit grading and land disturbance activities, the City, along with 58 other municipalities, St. Louis County, and the Metropolitan Sewer District, operate under a Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources?

Permit requirements cover a wide range of topics which impact water quality, including posting pet waste disposal signs, ensuring that development sites contain proper silt and erosion control, and bi-annual street sweeping. Additionally, the City must operate its facilities in such a manner to minimize exposure to storm water and must train its personnel annually in proper water quality practices.

If you are wondering what you can do regarding water quality, please remember that all storm water inlets drain to creeks and streams. Please ensure that no trash, debris, or chemicals are washed or dumped into storm water inlets. Additionally, if you are planning a grading project, please contact the City to determine whether a permit is necessary.



Public Works Department Accreditation



In 2015, the City's Department of Public Works became the 100th agency in North America accredited by the American Public Works Association (APWA).

On April 4, 2023, a group of evaluators from APWA assessed the City's Department of Public Works for compliance in 135 practices. The site visit was an overwhelming success and the evaluators enthusiastically recommended the City's Department of Public Works for Re-Accreditation, including three "model practices" to be considered by other agencies.

Chesterfield is one of eight accredited Public Works agencies in the State of Missouri.

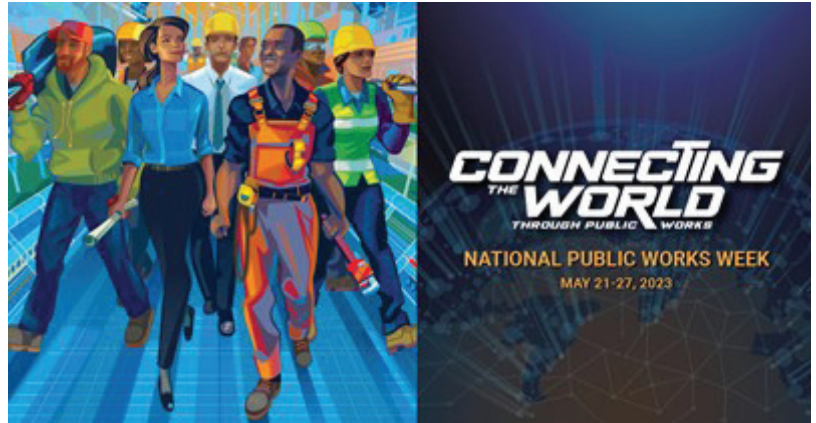


Public Works Week

The City of Chesterfield is comprised of 183 miles of public roads, 260 miles of public sidewalks, and over 18,000 street trees, each of which is maintained by the Internationally Accredited City of Chesterfield Department of Public Works.

Since 1960, the American Public Works Association (APWA) has sponsored National Public Works Week. This year, the theme is “Connecting the World Through Public Works.”

Public Works maintains the infrastructure which connects us all, no matter where we live in the world. Every Public Works Professional strives to improve the quality of life for the community they serve – leading to healthier and happier communities.

Public Right of Way

Any construction or physical disturbances within the public right of way, including sprinkler systems, invisible fences, the planting or removal of trees, and driveway replacements, requires a permit from the Public Works Department. If a street does not contain sidewalk, the public right of way is typically considered the area within 12 feet of the back of curb.

Movable objects should not be kept in the public right of way, including basketball goals and decorative landscape boulders.

Utilities within Public Right of Way

Utility agencies, including water, sewer, electric, gas, and telecommunications, have the legal right to place facilities within the public right of way. The City requires that these agencies obtain a permit to ensure that the right of way is restored to City standards. That said, the City has no control over the operation of these utilities or the services they provide, including work in private easements.

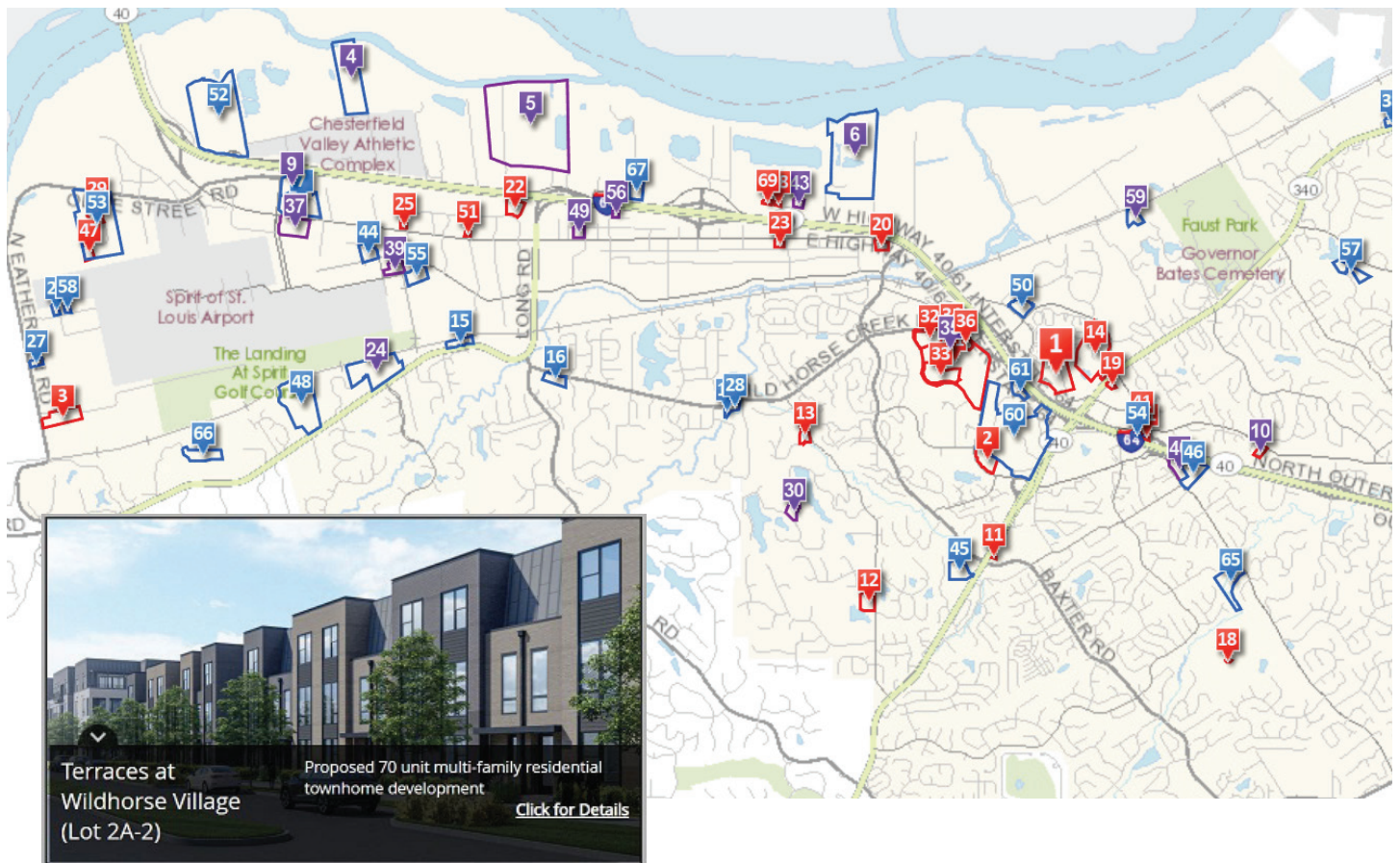
If you have a concern about a contractor or utility working on your property, you should contact the contractor directly to ensure they have the authority to work on your property. If work is occurring near the street or within public right of way and the contractor has obtained a permit, the City will provide you with any information we have regarding the contractor or utility.

Permitting Process Overview for Improvement Projects

Usually, the first question that comes to mind when starting an improvement project is ‘Do I need a permit?’ And, most of the time you do. But where do you start? The City of Chesterfield contracts with St. Louis County as the Building Code Authority over most improvement projects within the City. Therefore, you will likely be coordinating with both the City and County for many of them. For strictly mechanical (furnace), plumbing, or electrical projects, St. Louis County will be the ‘go-to.’ But for interior remodeling projects and exterior projects such as generators, solar panel arrays, additions, decks and others, you will begin with the City in the form of a Municipal Zoning Application (MZA) before County’s building permit process.



The City’s review involves confirming that requirements are being met such as setbacks and other aspects of the Municipal and Zoning Code. Once the City returns the approved documents, you must go through St. Louis County’s building permit process. When St. Louis County has granted your project final inspection approval, they will provide the City with a Certificate of Final Inspection which will subsequently be released to the property owner, thus completing the process. The municipal permit file remains open until this cycle is complete.



This is a general overview and questions might come up as you get deeper into the process. The Municipal Zoning Approval Application Page has a great deal of information for you but we are happy to assist if you need additional guidance. Subdivision Trustee Information

The City’s Planning Department makes an effort to give a courtesy notification to our Subdivision Trustees when an exterior residential improvement project application is submitted. We rely on the trustees to keep the City’s Database updated – this includes the names of current members and their contact information. Ascension Church Celebrates 100 Years

Ascension Catholic Church of Chesterfield kicked off its 14-month-long centennial celebration on April 17 with a special Mass officiated by Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski. Although 100 years ago the Catholic population in the Chesterfield area was sparse, they wanted their own church. Prior to 1923, area Catholics had to attend Mass at St. Anthony's in Centaur or St. Monica's in Creve Coeur. The Reverend Louis Schultz and his cousin Joseph Schultz put their time and effort into founding and supporting a new church. On April 17, 1923, ground was broken for the newly formed Ascension Church on land donated by Theresa Reuther. The cornerstone was laid on May 10. The following year, the newly completed building was dedicated as a mission church to St. Anthony's Parish. The Reverend Vincent McCarney served as pastor of both churches. Ray Ruby, in his book *Do Tell Hear the Corn Grow*, recalled how he and his seven siblings would walk two miles from their home on Griffen Lane to Ascension Church for 7 a.m. Mass every Sunday. They would arrive early so their mother, Mary Becker Ruby, could sing in the choir. The Rinkels, owners of Rinkel's Market, supported the new church by providing food for church fundraisers. In 1941, Father McCarney initiated the construction of a two-room school with a finished basement and modern conveniences, however his successor, the Reverend John F. Godfrey, completed the project. Over a hundred parishioners attended the groundbreaking on July 30. The school served approximately 40 students in eight grades. Current student enrollment is 409. In 1964, the parish had only 109 families registered, but it had outgrown the little church by 1977, so a larger new church was built. Today it serves 2800 families and possible expansion is being discussed.

A variety of activities have been planned to celebrate Ascension's first 100 years. Three pilgrimages for parishioners are on the agenda. These include one to Italy, another to the Shrine of St. Rose Philippine Duchesne in Florissant, Missouri, and a third to some local Marian Shrines. Some other events include a reunion of couples who were married in Ascension Church, a school alumni reunion, Fair Ascension on September 23, 2023, and Winterfest on January 28, 2024. A parish gala with an auction is scheduled at the Factory on April 20, 2024. The centennial will conclude with an outdoor Mass at noon on May 24, 2024, the 100th anniversary of the little church dedication, followed by a picnic lunch and games. A book on the history of Ascension Church by Robert Schultz should be available for purchase during the centennial year. Ascension parishioners, as well as the wider community, can participate in a memorable and informative look at the past.
