Re: PUBLIC STREET ACCEPTANCE – Old Chesterfield Road

As was planned, after completion of the Wild Horse Creek Road project, St. Louis County removed the section of roadway formerly known as Chesterfield Airport Road through Old Chesterfield from the County Arterial Road System. St. Louis County also renamed that section of street, which is no longer contiguous to any part of Chesterfield Airport Road, as Old Chesterfield Road. Accordingly, the City of Chesterfield is responsible for maintenance of the roadway.

A proposed ordinance for formal acceptance of the street is attached.

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO THE ACCEPTANCE OF OLD CHESTERFIELD ROAD BETWEEN BAXTER ROAD AND WILD HORSE CREEK ROAD IN THE CITY OF CHESTERFIELD

WHEREAS, the realignment of the former Wild Horse Creek Road and Chesterfield Airport Road intersection resulted in Wild Horse Creek Road becoming the through street; and

WHEREAS, St. Louis County Ordinance No. 420, 2007 renamed the section of Chesterfield Airport Road between Baxter Road and Wild Horse Creek Road as Old Chesterfield Road; and

WHEREAS, St. Louis County Ordinance No. 420, 2007 removed Old Chesterfield Road from the St. Louis County Arterial Road System.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHESTERFIELD, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Old Chesterfield Road from Baxter Road to Wild Horse Creek Road, 2,800 feet long, is hereby accepted by the City of Chesterfield for future care and maintenance.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
