RE: Electric Charging Stations



As you may recall, in 2022 the Planning and Public Works Committee directed Staff to pursue proposals to install electric charging stations on City properties. On June 14, 2022 I issued a Request for Proposals (RFP), from which two proposals were received. After reviewing the proposals I initially chose the submittal from Red E Charging as the most beneficial to the City of Chesterfield. Red E Charging indicated that it would install charging stations on City property at no cost to the City, with Red E Charging recouping their costs through Ameren incentives and charges to the users. While this sounded "too good to be true" to me, I did check references who indicated that Red E Charging had in fact done this in their city. Accordingly, I worked with Red E Charging for several months in an attempt to move this project forward. Ultimately, on April 25, 2023 Red E Charging notified the City of Chesterfield that it was walking away from this project.

Once negotiations with Red E Charging were terminated I contacted IBP who had provided the second proposal. I have had several productive conversations and site meetings with IBP, resulting the in the three proposals attached. Specifically, these are as follows:

As you can see, the proposals provided include a total of 18 charging ports throughout three City properties at a total net cost of \$192,677. These charging stations would be "pay" stations, and we would expect to recoup all electric and operation / maintenance costs through the fees paid by the user.

In addition to charging stations, I have investigated whether the City should begin incorporating electric vehicles into its fleet. Through Ameren, I was able to secure an Electrification Fleet Assessment (EFA) at no cost. The EFA shows that it is not technically feasible to convert a large portion of our fleet to electric vehicles at this time, primarily because the technology is not available (large trucks) or the electrification is impractical (PD vehicles that are used 24 hours per day). There are some vehicles which are both technically feasible and economically justifiable (such as parks vehicles, inspector vehicles, and pool vehicles). That said, I am reticent to recommend any implementation of electric vehicles at this time due to limited savings, the upfront cost of charging stations, and logistic difficulties associated with charging.

After reviewing this matter at length it is my recommendation that we do NOT move forward with electric vehicles or electric charging stations at this time. While the current Ameren incentive (\$5,000 per port or \$90,000 total) is substantial, I cannot justify the remaining expenditure (\$192.677) at this time.

Action Recommended

This matter should be forwarded to the Planning and Public Works Committee of City Council for its consideration. Should PPW concur with Staff's recommendation it should take no action. Should PPW determine that either electric charging stations or electric vehicles should be pursued further, it should direct Staff accordingly.

Please forward to the PPW for review and further direction.

STANDARD FORM PROPOSAL AND CONTRACT

Wherever the words "Electrical Contractor" and "Customer" may appear hereafter they shall refer to the respective parties named on the reverse side hereof and signatory hereto.

- 1. This proposal is in accordance with our understanding of the requirements of the project and from verbal information which we received from the Customer, or its agents, and if written plans and specifications are furnished by Customer, the Electrical Contractor's interpretation of them. The Electrical Contractor assumes no responsibility as to the accuracy of such plans and specifications. It is further understood and agreed that this proposal and contract does not include any labor or materials not specifically mentioned herein. Unless otherwise provided in the plans and specifications, the Electrical Contractor shall have the right to select all materials. When specified materials are unavailable, the Electrical Contractor shall have the right to substitute for such specified materials other materials of equal or better quality. On remodeling or relocation jobs, the Electrical Contractor shall have the right to use any existing materials if suitable and to keep any materials that have been replaced by new materials.
- 2. Terms and amount of payment shall be those specified on the reverse side hereof. Payment shall be made on completion of this contract where the work is completed within a period of 30 days.
