

RE:

Metro St. Louis Cooperative Deicing Salt Program



The City of Chesterfield, on behalf of the Coop, most recently bid the purchase and deliver of deicing salt in the summer of 2011. At that time, the low bids were provided by North American Salt (\$41.89 / ton) and Beelman Logistics, LLC (\$8.38 / ton). North American Salt and Beelman Logistics have served the Coop well, and both are willing to provide their salt and delivery services in 2013 at the same unit price. The original contract allowed for one optional one year extension, which the City, on behalf of the Coop, exercised in 2012. Since another extension appears to be in the interest of all parties, I hereby request authorization to purchase salt and delivery again through these vendors in 2013. Such authorization will allow the continued use of vendors which have served the Coop well, ensures no unit cost increase, and saves the time and expense of bidding.

Action Recommended

This matter should be forwarded to the Planning and Public Works Committee for its consideration of approval of authorization for the City Administrator to execute contracts with North American Salt and Beelman Logistics LLC for the purchase and delivery of deicing salt at the prices previously provided. Said contract will include language to allow unlimited one year extensions, with the consent of both parties, provided any unit price increase does not exceed any increase in the consumer price index (CPI) as measured by the Department of Labor. If such authorization is granted, the price and service of both vendors would be analyzed each year and, if satisfactory, any contract extension could be approved by the City Administrator. If endorsed by the Planning and Public Works Committee, this proposal will ultimately require City Council approval.

Per your direction I contacted Beelman Logistics LLC to inquire if they would be willing to extend that same bid price into the 2013-2014 salt delivery season.

Please see the attached letter from Beelman in which they agreed to extend those prices into the 2013-2014 year. The base price for managing and unloading the salt is \$2.39 per ton. BID RESULTS - DEICING SALT - UNLOADING/DELIVERY

As detailed in the enclosed MEMO, prepared by Brian McGownd, Public Works Director/City Engineer, bids were recently opened regarding the unloading and delivery of deicing salt to each of the participants in the St. Louis METRO Branch APWA Salt Cooperative.

Based upon a review of Mr. McGownd's recommendation, I join with him in recommending to you award of a contract to Beelman Logistics, LLC, at a total cost of \$8.38/ton. This price has increased, from \$8.04/ton, under last year's contract with Lange Stegman. This increase is likely due to increased fuel costs. Obviously our total cost will depend upon the severity of the winter. We are fortunate in that we had a very mild winter, last year, and we have a substantial salt storage facility, which is currently FULL, containing approximately 6000 tons of salt.

The Department of Public Works solicited bids for unloading, loading and delivery by truck to various municipalities in conjunction with the St. Louis Metro Branch APWA Salt Cooperative. For several years, the Department of Public Works has coordinated the purchase and delivery of deicing materials to approximately 40 members of the salt coop. The salt coop allows the various municipalities to pool their purchase requests and gain the benefit of a large bulk user. This bid package provides for the administration and scheduling, unloading, trucking and delivery of deicing salt to each of the participating municipalities storage location. Due to the necessity of a barge unloading facility as well as trucking capabilities, a limited number of participants qualify to bid, therefore, a total of two bids were received.

I concur with the recommendation of our Superintendent of Maintenance Operations, Mike O'Connor, to accept the apparent low bid, as submitted by Beelman Logistics LLC. The itemized bid identifies the cost of service for each municipality, in the attached bid summary.

The bid cost to provide the unloading and delivery services to the City of Chesterfield's salt storage dome is \$8.38 per ton.

This bid, when taken in conjunction with the salt supply cost results in a delivered cost of \$50.27.
