## Archery range

- Originally an ARPA funded project estimated around \$40,000
- Location moved to next to the shooting range
- Repairing existing berm at shooting range, and extending it for archery increased costs
- Adding parking area increased costs
- Survey, topographic mapping, site improvement plan, and MSD requirements increased costs
- Required MSD and USACE approval before proceeding
- Discovered roadways would need additional work increased costs
- Estimate an additional \$275,000+ would be needed to complete project
- Strongly considering abandoning the project due to increased costs

## Amphitheater

- Bond Architects cost estimates as of February 2024
  - Back of House (BOH): \$ 1,461,000
  - Restroom: \$ 810,000
  - TOTAL: \$ 2,271,000 (current budget \$ 2,300,000)
- Next meeting TBD mid-May
  - Design & construction documents 90% complete
  - Updated cost estimate
  - Current construction estimated late September 2024 through May 2025

## Central Park playground

- Considering replacing if awarded grant and council approves additional funding
- Staff working with multiple vendors for conceptual designs

## Chesterfield Family Aquatic Center (CFAC)

- Currently looking to hire another 15 lifeguards and 15 aquatic aids
- Cleaning, painting, and filling pools in preparation for opening day
- May 25-27 (12-6:30), May 28-31 (4-7), June 1-August 11 (12-7 M-F, 12-6:30 Sat/Sun/holidays)

## Chesterfield Valley Athletic Complex (CVAC)

- Started 2024 season in March, getting busier every weekend, schedule in packet

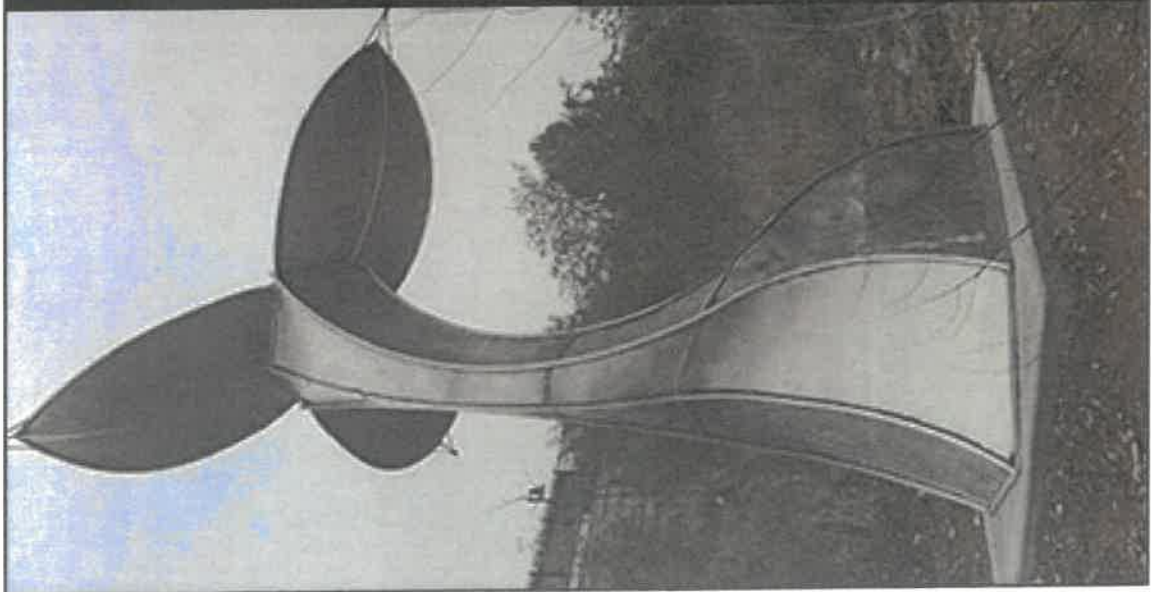

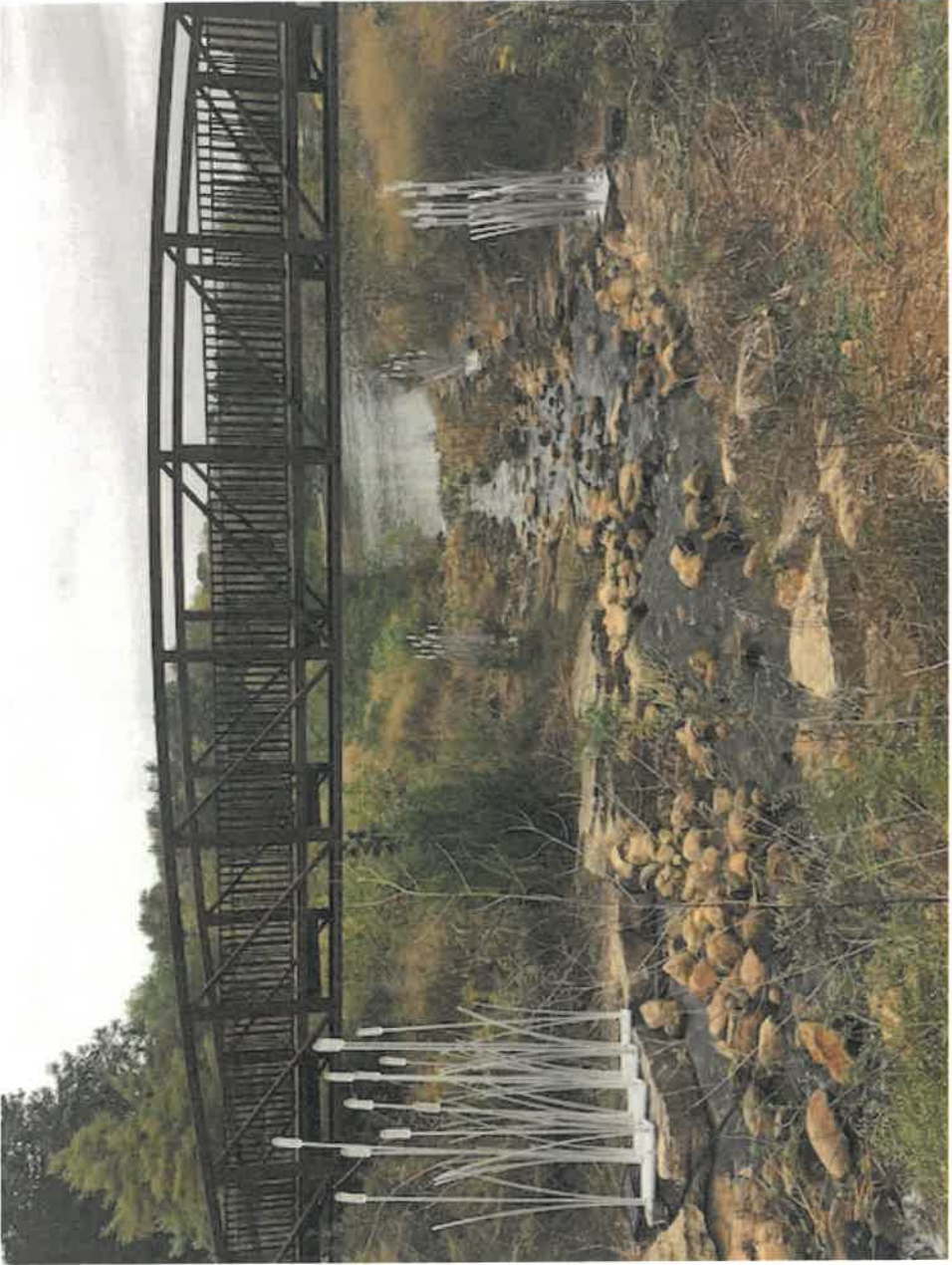
## Flow

"Flow," is an interactive sculpture created by Leland Drexler-Russell, that brings attention to the native plants of the Missouri wetlands: the Broadleaf Cattail (*Typha Latifolia*) and the Yellow Lotus (*Nelumbo Lutea*). The sculpture, located near the bridge in Central Park, contains four broadleaf cattail clusters and a large lotus flower with solar panels located in the petals. These petals powered by the sunlight, harvest energy to the lotus flower creating a glow at night, resting on a lily pad on the lake. The illuminated lake will create a scenic backdrop to the Chesterfield Amphitheater during summer events.

"Flow" is located near the bridge in Central Park.

## The Fox

The Fox” is a life-size bronze sculpture depicting the life of a young fox leaping through the tall grass and running next to the trees. The work of art was created by artist and St. Louis native, Harry Weber, in 2004. Weber’s work embodies human emotion and power with a spontaneity developed from a lifelong habit of sketching from life.

“The Fox” is perfectly placed between the Family Aquatic Center and the playground in Chesterfield’s Central Park.
