MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHESTERFIELD AT 690 CHESTERFIELD PARKWAY WEST

OCTOBER 18, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 7 p.m.

Mayor Bob Nation led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance and followed with a moment of silent prayer.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the October 4, 2021 City Council meeting were submitted for approval. Councilmember Moore made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Mastorakos, to approve the October 4, 2021 City Council minutes. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

There were no communications and petitions.

APPOINTMENTS

There were no appointments.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS AND ASSOCIATED LEGISLATION

Planning/Public Works Committee

Councilmember Mary Monachella, Chairperson of the Planning/Public Works Committee, indicated that there were no action items scheduled on the agenda for this meeting, and the next meeting of this Committee is scheduled for Thursday, October 21, at 5:30 p.m.

Finance and Administration Committee

Councilmember Michael Moore, Chairperson of the Finance and Administration Committee, made a motion, seconded by Councilmember McGuinness, to approve the October 11, 2021 Finance and Administration Committee of the Whole Minutes. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

Councilmember Moore announced that the Finance and Administration Committee met immediately prior to the Council meeting and action items from that meeting would be addressed at the next City Council meeting.

Parks, Recreation & Arts Committee

Councilmember Mary Ann Mastorakos, Chairperson of the Parks, Recreation & Arts Committee, indicated that there were no action items scheduled on the agenda for this meeting.

Public Health & Safety Committee

Bill No. 3362	Repeals and replaces City of Chesterfield Ordinance 2952 to update the requirements for deer control policy and deer hunting regulations (First Reading) Public Health and Safety Committee recommends approval
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Councilmember Tom DeCampi, Chairperson of the Public Health & Safety Committee, made a motion, seconded by Councilmember McGuinness, for the first reading of Bill No. 3362. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed. Bill No. 3362 was read for the first time.

Bill No. 3363 Repeals and replaces City of Chesterfield Ordinance 88 to update the prohibition of fireworks within the corporate limits of the City of Chesterfield pursuant to Section 320.21 Revised Missouri Statutes
(First Reading) Public Health and Safety Committee recommends approval

Councilmember DeCampi made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Wahl, for the first reading of Bill No. 3363. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed. Bill No. 3363 was read for the first time.

Councilmember McGuinness made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Budoor, to accept Chief Johnson's recommendation to permit limited stationary radar enforcement on Highway 64-40 to assigned traffic officers and/or in conjunction with the state or federal enforcement operations. Discussion ensued. A roll call vote was taken with the following results: Ayes – Monachella, Budoor and McGuinness. Nays – Mastorakos, DeCampi, Hurt, Wahl and Moore. Whereupon Mayor Nation declared the motion failed.

REPORT FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

City Administrator Mike Geisel reported that The Beardly Man, 17081 N. Outer 40 Road, #214 – The District Chesterfield, and Symbol, 137 Chesterfield Towne Center, have each requested a new liquor license to sell all kinds of liquor by the drink, to be consumed on premise, and Sunday sales. Mr. Geisel reported that, per City policy, these applications have been reviewed and are now recommended for approval by both the Police Department and Planning & Development Services. Councilmember Moore made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Wahl, to approve issuance of a new liquor license to The Beardly Man and Symbol. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed.

OTHER LEGISLATION

Bill No. 3364 Amends Chapter 600, Article II, Section 1 of the City of Chesterfield Municipal Code to revise language pertaining to liquor license requirements **(First Reading) Department of Planning recommends approval**

Councilmember Budoor made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Monachella, for the first reading of Bill No. 3364. A voice vote was taken with a unanimous affirmative result and the motion was declared passed. Bill No. 3364 was read for the first time.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Councilmember Wahl read a brief statement and made a motion, seconded by Councilmember DeCampi, requesting the City of Chesterfield respect the intelligence and integrity of its residents, staff and business partners and direct staff to immediately implement a policy that within any City facility, wearing a mask is to be voluntary and at the discretion of the individual, through the remainder of the Coronavirus pandemic. Discussion ensued. A roll call vote was taken with the following results: Ayes – Wahl and DeCampi. Nays – Moore, McGuinness, Mastorakos, Monachella, Hurt and Budoor. Whereupon Mayor Nation declared the motion failed.

NEW BUSINESS

There was no new business.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to discuss, Mayor Nation adjourned the meeting at 7:59 p.m.
