Chris Landram called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

OLD BUSINESS

September minutes approved.

Arland reported that 36 calendars sold in September. She gave each member 10 calendars to sell for \$5.00 each.

At Faust Park Heritage Days \$181.00 was collected for calendars, cemetery books, coloring books and Dan's book. One of Mark's books sold for a total in receipts of \$196.00.

Financial Liaison Bob Landram said the September balance of \$14,521.84 included Faust Park sales. He said Chesterfield is doing a good job in reporting sales by breakdown of books or calendars.

We have a new calendar sponsor WestBridge Bank on North Outer 40 and Boone's Crossong. The grand opening is October 24th. We will be represented that day in the lobby and have our books and calendars. Arland will set up the display from 9-11, Doris from 11-1 and Ted and Nell from 1-3.

Arland picked up the minutes of past years from Carol Broemmer. Dan will take them home and put them into books according to year. They will be stored in our space at the government center.

Ted spoke of the excellent placement of the committee display and sales table in the Hoch House at the Faust Festival.

Dan Rothwell presented the new green coloring books. They will be sent to the principal's of 15 grade schools in the area and they may copy them. The sale price will be \$5.00 each. Dave Borlin offered to store the books at his home.

Arland said the Chesterfield Historical book is coming along and the committee has a meeting on November 29.

The artifacts committee represented by Stan Dampier and Henry Pecherski, said we have been given a huge collection of Indian artifacts by a private party. They said Mark Leach is working with the city on a mound protection ordinance and will be trying to establish a buddy system to watch mound areas before new developments begin.

Jane said that she and Terry had walked into Conway Cemetery in trying to determine the help that is needed. Henry and Stan agreed to try and clean it out so that some other teams of people can keep it up, by working monthly. The boundaries are needed as they have changed with developers coming into the area. Jane stated that our committee committed to accept responsibility for the cemetery in 1988 when we ask for it from St. Louis County. She hopes perhaps the City eventually will become involved if we can get it cleaned up.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Clifford Frazier, committee member, who has not attended for a few years, was called and he requested that his name be removed from membership due to his health.

Chris asked if we should have a program for the public. The committee agreed that attendance at past programs did not warrant a program at this time.
