- A. Welcome City Council Liaison-Guy Tilman & OASIS Rep – Dan Steinmeyer  
*Introduction were made ad new members welcomed. Bonnie reviewed the mission statement of the Committee.*
- B. Senior Sampler Planning-April 7 at YMCA 10 am – 1 p.m.  
*Need to prepare flyer for event, initial solicitation of previous vendors was sent in December and may have responded. Libbey will send out vendor spreadsheet. Parking is an issue. Need to direct patrons to park at Central Park and ride shuttle. Advertise this and have signage. Need police assistance at YMCA parking lot “exit” to keep people from parking there. Make sure exhibitors are parking on lower parking lot and not using main entrance. Becky will check with Delmar Gardens on Shuttle. Need to check with Annemarie on what time set up can take place the day before. Review 2016 Wrap Up Notes. Make sure ITN has a table.*

*Bonnie & Libbey provided an update on the ITN Gateway Transportation plan. Currently the Steering Committee is in a fundraising and awareness mode. Good response from newsletter article from those needing the service. Plans are being service in the spring or summer, when at least \$50,000 is raised. Still need office space for dispatchers.
