



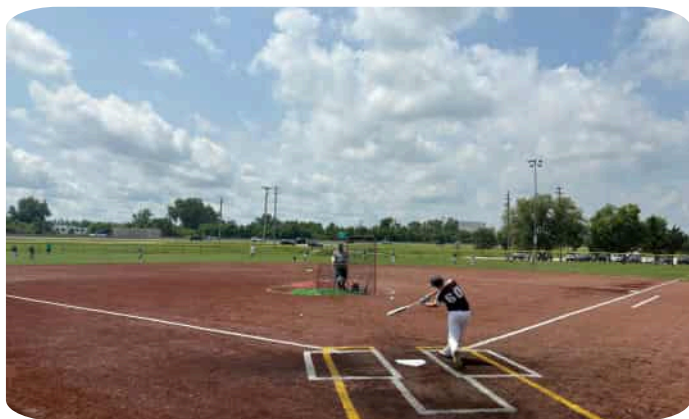
# MONTHLY REPORT - JULY 2024



## Baseball/Softball

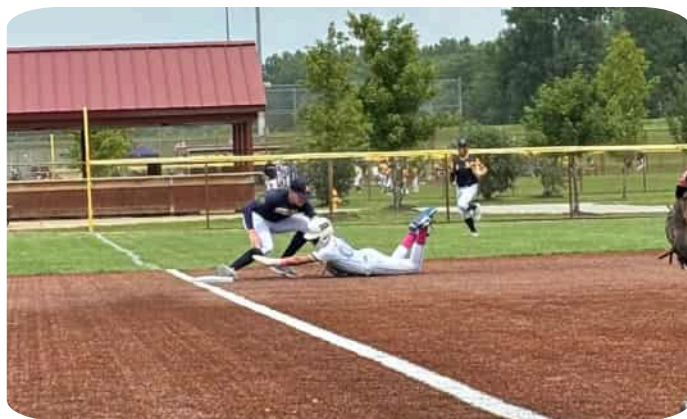
### **Perfect Game**

- Put up and took down temp fences in F, E, and C quad

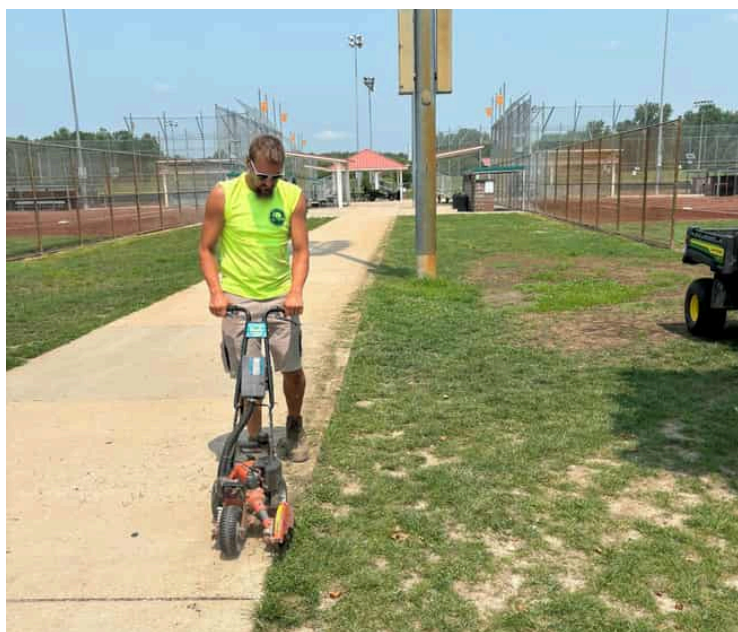


### CVAC continued

## Aquatics

Attendance from July 1- July 31 was 12,265 people.

This includes general admission, programs, swim/dive team practice and meet attendance. In the month of July, we hosted:

- 4 Tot Times
- 1 scuba session
- 1 SUP STL
- 1 Dive-In Movie event
- 8 Splash and Play times
- 2 sessions of sold-out swim lessons
- 14 birthday parties
- 11 group swims
- 32 Riverwalk dates
- 1 swim/dive meet

- We have sold season passes this year, generating approximately \$66,400 to date.
- Dive in Movie: We had 51 people in attendance July 26 for Super Mario Brothers. Our sponsor, Monarch Fire Protection District, made snow cones and handed out prizes.
- July 28, Monarch Fire Protection District attended In-Service with our lifeguard staff to work on transfer of care. This life saving training helps prepare facility staff during an emergency.
- We had only 2 rain days this month.

### What is an audit?

Our audit from Ellis and Associates was on June 2 and we received the standard “Meets” which is the highest level.

The unannounced lifeguard audit begins when a member of Jeff Ellis & Associates arrives onsite while appearing to be a regular guest. The biggest task for the auditor is to secretly film the performance of all lifeguards and facility staff members. Once the staff has been filmed the auditor reveals him or herself to the manager and arrangements are made to evaluate the skills of all lifeguards on site. The auditor will grade them on skills like CPR, rescue techniques, and more from the audit checklist. The auditor will also review all documentation (sign-in sheets, maintenance records, accident reports, etc.) to ensure everything is in place and readily available.
