

Attendance from June 1-June 30 was 14,782 people. This includes general admission, programs and swim/dive team practice and meet attendance. In the month of June, we hosted:

- We have sold 513 season passes this year, generating almost \$61,000 so far.
- Dive in movie: We had 126 people in attendance June 28 for Super Mario Brothers. Our sponsor, Monarch Fire Protection District made snow cones and handed out prizes. This program generated over \$1,200.
- June 9 & 19, Monarch Fire Protection District attended in-service with our lifeguard staff to work on transfer of care. This life saving training helps prepare facility staff during an emergency.

- We had only 2 rain days this month.



- Installed sod on Clarkson medians


